RE: Freedom of Information Access Request

The Township of Delhi has requested the ministry to supply information on Class 1 and 5 aggregate stone chip from Oxford Sand and Gravel Ltd.

First of all, the A.S.L. Aggregate Sources List shows Granular "A" and "B" and Hot Mix fine and coarse aggregate and sometimes select sub-grade material, (S.S.M.). *The Ministry of Transportation in Southwestern Region does not have any surface treated highways, therefore, would not include this information on the A.S.L. However, since surface treatment is an asphalt product, it would still require the appropriate physical and gradation requirements as per O.P.S. 304, (see attached copies).

I have supplied three sheets of test results taken periodically from 1989 to 1994, to qualify material for M.T.O. contract use in the area. The A.S.L. is a qualifier and does not necessarily guarantee the material forever. That is why M.T.O. checks material before using it on specific contracts.

The ministry has tried to impress upon the municipalities that any material purchased from aggregate producers should have preliminary testing and production sampling to assure good quality road building materials.
